

### **Kids In The Middle**

Community-based prevention model mentoring program, pairing 'At-Promise' youth 1:1 with volunteer mentors from the community who spend an hour a week, every week for at least one year having fun, exploring new and exciting opportunities within the community, and building the skills and character needed to realize their greatest potential.

#### Youth in the KIM program are:

- 2x more likely to plan for their futures
- 3x less likely to commit an act of violence or delinquency
- Demonstrate better attendance grades, and graduation rates over non-mentored peers
